In the event Supplier has misrepresented any information contained herein, or presented inaccurate, noncurrent or incomplete information, Supplier acknowledges and agrees to indemnify Buyer for all damages, fines, penalties, reductions in contract values, and any other losses (including attorneys' fees) incurred by Buyer as a result of a determination by the U.S. Government that the Item(s) identified herein are not commercial items.
